

Blueberry Brioche Tutorial

sl1yo

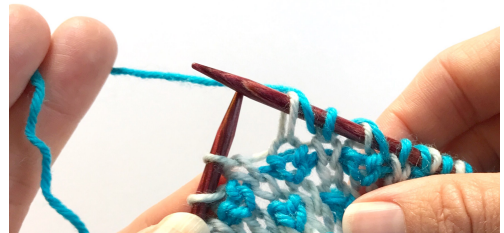
Bring the yarn to the front of the work, and insert the tip into the stitch purlwise.



Bring the yarn over the needle and stitch.



Slip the stitch and the yarn draping it off the needle.



“[k1, sl1yo] to end of row” will look like this: one knit stitch and one stitch draped with a yo. (You’ll notice that the draped yo doesn’t always actually drape the stitch and sometimes rests beside the stitch. This doesn’t matter - just always work these two components of the brioche stitch as one.)



sl1+yo

Bring the yarn to the front of the work, insert the tip purlwise into the stitch and previous yo.



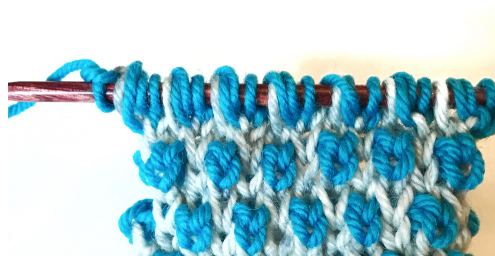
Bring the yarn over the needle and the stitch + yo.



Slip the stitch + yo and the new yarnover draping it off the needle.



“[k1, sl1+yo] to end of row” will look like this: one knit stitch and one stitch draped twice with yarnovers. (You’ll notice that the yarnovers don’t always actually drape the stitch and sometimes rest beside the stitch. This doesn’t matter - just always work these components of the brioche stitch as one.)



brk+1

Insert the tip knitwise into the stitch and both yarnovers.



Knit the stitch together with both of its yarnovers.



Slip the stitch off the needle.



“[k1, brk+1] to end of row” will look like this:
